#### **British Wireless for the Blind**

Just a reminder that we are still agents for British Wireless for the Blind, and by providing audio equipment on a free loan to those who are unable to afford a specially adapted radio they help improve the daily lives of visually impaired people.

BWBF Connect enables recipients to receive a device via a doorstep delivery. They then receive a phone call from a member of BWBF's team who can talk to them through the set up and answer any questions they may have, ensuring that they get full use of the equipment.

### To receive a free device via BWBF Connect, the recipient must meet the following criteria:

- Resident in the UK
- Registered or registerable blind or partially sighted
- Over the age of eight
- In receipt of a <u>means-tested benefit</u> (or parent/guardian in receipt if under 18)

#### Winter fire safety

House fires and casualties increase during winter, with a high risk over the festive period and the Scottish Fire & Service have issued some valuable advice for the public;

#### Festive safety tips

- Check your smoke and heat alarms are working.
   Replace batteries if necessary.
- If you have an open fire make sure your chimney is swept before winter. Always use a fire guard, secured in position, to protect against flying sparks from hot embers.
- Never place Christmas cards or decorations around the mantelpiece.
- Check your Christmas light plugs are fitted with the correct fuse, don't overload extension leads and ensure all electrical devices are Intertek BEAB approved.
- Always switch Christmas lights off and unplug them before you go to bed.
- Decorations can burn easily don't place them near lights or heaters.
- Never leave cooking unattended, especially when using hot oil. For early warning of fire consider fitting a heat alarm in your kitchen.

#### Using electric blankets

- Never leave an electric blanket switched on when you're in bed unless it's marked 'suitable for all night use'
- Ensure your electric blanket is tested and serviced in accordance with manufacturer's guidance,

in particular after the guarantee runs out.

Manufacturers often recommend testing blankets every 3 years.

- Check the blanket, plug and flex regularly for damage (e.g. fraying fabric, scorch marks, exposed wires). If you're in any doubt, don't use the blanket.
- Store electric blankets safely roll them, don't fold them.

- be living with a diagnosed mental health condition that prevents you from leaving your home without the assistance of another person
- be housebound or bedbound due to a physical disability
